COLORS

**Ultramarine Blue

**Indian Yellow (not opaque)

Opaque:

Cadmium Red Light

Cadmium Yellow Light

Cerulean Blue

**Titanium White

I make my own black by mixing Indian Yellow, Ultramarine Blue or Phthalo Blue, and Alizarin Crimson. Adding white makes beautiful grays.

Optional Colors:

Phthalo Blue (red shade)

Phthalo Green

**BRUSHES

I use a variety of flats and angled brushes (Princeton 1/2" stroke brush is my

favorite because you can use flat surface and tips for painting) Simply Simons

makes an inexpensive great Rigger for lines and details. Also, you can add a fan

brush. Palette knife.

PALETTES

I use a Masterson Sta-Wet palette 12 x 16 size. DK Art Supply in Leesburg

carries a variety of palettes. (For our class I have some palette sheets that you

can use if you don't want to make investment or you can use a plastic plate)

**Gesso Primed canvas or Ampersand gessobord panels (size you prefer)
